Term 2 Procedures

Good Afternoon Parents/Caregivers,

Some information regarding next week:

If you have nominated that your child will be attending school from next week, we look forward to seeing them on Monday morning, as per normal times! Students will be required to attend in full school uniform whilst attending school. However, we do ask that students wear their formal uniform on a Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and their sports uniform on a Wednesday and Friday. We are conscious of balancing student learning with student well-being, so our plan is to provide recreational and physical activities for all students, every Wednesday and Friday afternoon.

Please be aware that due to new restrictions, we will not be holding Food Friday in Term 2.

To reiterate the advice of the state government, along with the College Principal, Mr Babbage, students attending school will be actively supervised and supported, as they work through the same work packs that students at home will be working through. We are aware of ensuring there is equity and consistency between learning at home, and learning at school.

Collection of work packs:

Work packs will be available for collection each Friday. At this time, we would request that you drop off the previous week's completed work pack, and collect the new weeks' worth of work, through a contactless drop off and pick up. We request that your child does not complete any of the work until they have received specific task instructions from the teacher. We suggest putting the work pack out of reach of eager children's hands, or those of their younger siblings!
