### *Introduction of Mark Lewis – Acting Deputy Principal*

Hello Trinity Community, I have been an educator since 1992 and am both primary and high school trained. I have been privileged to be in leadership in schools since 2000 and have had so many opportunities through God's grace to educate, encourage and equip students to reach personal excellence through Christ. One highlight for me was to help build a school in Zambia for 250 orphans to be fed and educated each day; this was done through establishing a charity and having our students actively involved in fundraising.

Over a five-year period, I trained students to long distance cycle and they rode from Perth to Albany and back in 8 days, 1168 km as a round trip. These experiences for students are life changing and many of the students who have graduated still reflect on what they were able to do to help others in dire need. Academic grades are important, however, the development of character is of greater significance, when a student is well-rounded and has a focus on others, rather than simply their academic aspirations, we see true education.

Aristotle wrote 'Education, without educating the heart is no education at all. As educators, we want students to engage in the full spectrum of activities available to them at school if they are to grow and flourish into active valuable members of the community with heart. Micah 6:8 says '...what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness and to walk humbly with your God?' My personal goal for students in education is that they take their place as active, engaged citizens, flourishing as a result of the attributes of kindness, mercy and love from what they have been taught at home and school together.

I look forward to this opportunity at Trinity College.
